Federal requirements such as the Olmstead decision and recent guidance from the US Department of Health and Human Services continue to emphasize the importance of ensuring that individuals living in institutions have the opportunity to learn about available community resources.

This webcast will educate healthcare professionals about how Money Follows the Person (MFP) programs can help eligible individuals transition from institutional settings back to their communities of choice, featuring the New York State MFP demonstration program. Participants will learn how transition specialists and peers can help support not only the individual, but also providers working in institutions and the community. Our guests will also discuss guidance from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Office of Civil Rights, which highlights the importance of offering nursing home residents the opportunity to learn about available community resources.
